Costs	Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme: the Government will cover up to 80% of salary (up to £2,500 per month) per employee for businesses to retain and furlough employees who would otherwise be made redundant due to Coronavirus related disruption – this will be backdated to 1 st March 2020	Available for businesses and charities of all sizes and sectors. Employers will be asked to submit information (details tbc) to an HMRC portal	No – HMRCare aiming to launch the scheme in the near future
Staff Co	Statutory Sick Pay Refund: the Government will refund employers up to 14 days statutory sick pay per employee off sick or self-isolating from day 1	Available for businesses and charities with under 250 employees.
